Product description

The NS-SFP+W27-10GBASE series single mode transceiver is small form factor pluggable module for duplexoptical data communications such as 10GBASE-LR/LW defined by IEEE 802.3ae. It is with the SFP+ 20-pin connector to allow hot plug capability.

The NS-SFP+W27-10GBASE module is designed for single mode fiber and operates at a nominal wavelength of 1330nm. The transmitter section uses a multiple quantum well DFB, which is class 1 laser compliant according to International Safety Standard IEC-60825.

The receiver section uses an integrated InGaAs detector preamplifier (IDP) mounted in an optical header and a limiting post-amplifier IC.

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Absolute Maximum Ratings




Figure 1. Electrical Pin-out Details

Notes:

- [1] Module circuit ground is isolated from module chassis ground within the module.
- [2].should be pulled up with 4.7k 10k ohms on host board to a voltage between 3.15Vand 3.6V.
- [3]Tx_Disable is an input contact with a 4.7 k Ω to 10 k Ω pullup to VccT inside the module.
- [4] Mod_ABS is connected to VeeT or VeeR in the SFP+ module. The host may pull this contact up to Vcc_Host with a resistor in the range $4.7 \text{ k}\Omega$ to $10 \text{ k}\Omega$. Mod_ABS is asserted "High" when the SFP+ module is physically absent from a host slot.
- [5] RS0 and RS1 are module inputs and are pulled low to VeeT with > 30 k Ω resistors in the module.




Figure 2. Host Board Power Supply Filters Circuit




Figure 3. Host-Module Interface




Figure 3. Key Mechanical Dimensions

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
